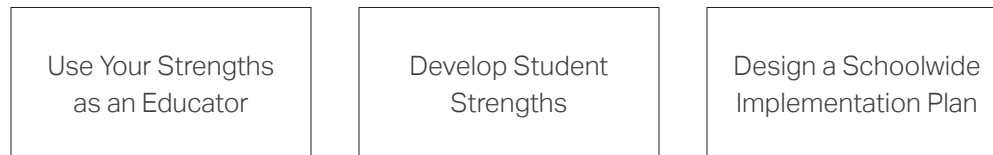


Building a Strengths-Based School in K-12 Course Series

INSTRUCTOR-LED COURSE

Building a strengths-based school means harnessing the potential of educators and students to empower individuals to do what they do best. Integrating strengths into a school requires implementing strategies that affect all aspects of the school and capitalizing on a systematic strengths-based development process for educators and students. Gallup created a series comprising three courses to help participants build a strengths-based school. The three courses in the series are:



The Use Your Strengths as an Educator course will help participants become aware of, appreciate and use their strengths in their work.

Who Should Attend

This course is for school leaders, strengths champions and student-facing educators.

What You Can Expect

A school's strengths initiative should involve all stakeholder groups, including students, staff, teachers, administrators and families. Participants will learn concrete approaches to support a parallel strengths development process between adults and students. Regardless of role, strengths development is a powerful tool to enhance individual and group success.

This course will provide participants with information to help them use their strengths as an educator. During this course participants will:

- learn about strengths-based education concepts and their impact on students
- acquire insights into their own natural talents and how to develop and use them as an educator
- create sustainable strategies to integrate strengths throughout the whole school

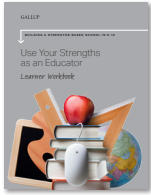

The learner workbook provides detailed information from the course. It includes reflection and activity pages for participants as well as valuable ideas about using your strengths as an educator.



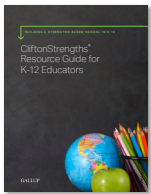
Playing My Strengths in a K-12 Setting
